# Changing Directions by Pastor Paul Moody

On a Sunday in mid-January, the Adventure Club saw the film Selma, which tells the story of the 1965 Civil Rights campaign to secure equal voting rights. At the end of the film, we sat in silence, deeply impacted by the powerful story we had just witnessed. One person from our group noted that it felt like Good Friday: heavy and hopeless. Perhaps it revealed parts of our human experience that we'd rather ignore.

Now as I sit here today, at a table in my favorite downtown café, I'm watching the Broadway traffic ebb and flow. It reminds me of the push and pull of our life together as people of faith, both through the years and



through the seasons. Life has a way of surprising us, both in good ways and in hard ways, and yet God's Spirit continually goes with us, uncovering the Way of Christ in our world.

As we approach Lent, one of the themes is turning around and changing direction in life. In biblical language, we call that "repentance". Yet, that is oftentimes easier to talk about than to actually live and do every day. But perhaps that's why God's Spirit is our advocate, our guide, and our breathe of life when we need it most. I give thanks for the gift of that Spirit that goes with us always, through each season and change in life.




On Monday evenings at the Tap House in Downtown Rochester, all are invited to Pub(lic) Theology, led by Pastor Paul Moody.



#### **Lutheran World Relief Baby Care Kit**

- Collection begins February 22
- Assembling & Blessing March 15

A Baby Care Kit from LWR is like a promise. It says to that baby and family, *Your needs will not be neglected by this world. You matter to us.* It provides encouragement by welcoming these little ones into an international community that cares.



Baby Care Kits are distributed as part of emergency and relief efforts, to be sure, but they are also given out as part of LWR health initiatives to encourage women to seek prenatal care.

#### Items needed for the Baby Care Kit:

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts
- Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannelFour cloth diapers
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap

- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of gentle soap, in original wrapping
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Help us reach a goal of sending 100 kits!

#### **Channel One Regional Food Bank**

The food bank at Channel One is a year-round ministry at Mount Olive. There will be a special Lenten collection which begins on Ash Wednesday. During Lent last year, Mount Olive collected food items and monetary donations totaling more than over 425 bags of groceries (one bag = \$10).

There are blue barrels in the front entry for nonperishable items. Please put your bag on the table next to the barrels so they can be counted before being sent off to Channel One.
