From the oratorio, Joseph Martin writes ...

"What is beneath the surface?" by Sara Hollander

We all enjoy entertainment: getting lost in a book or video game, going to the theatre or a concert, or watching a basketball game on TV. Why is it so easy to fill our time with entertainment? Is it safe? Does it allow us to "go beneath the surface"?

As we continue to walk through Lent, questions come to mind that will not have answers, but asking encourages us to "go beneath the surface". Asking questions makes us vulnerable, opens a space for others to reflect, ponder, share their story. *Slow down!* Make space and time for questions and *listening*!

Here are some ways to make time for family devotions:

- Put a box or jar in the middle of a table. Anyone can place a question or thought in the container. Pick a time to sit together and draw a question from the container to reflect on.
- After enjoying some form of entertainment, reflect on how it relates to your life. What values are expressed? Are they similar to your values? How do those values impact you?
- Read a story together. Who do you relate to in this story and why?
- Mark a time each week to draw a picture or write an affirmation note to one another.
- Create a wheel with various emotions on it. Share a story about a time when you were scared, sad, silly, angry, etc. Was God present?

High School youth exploring world religions have invited Regina Mustafa, the founder of the Community Interfaith Dialogue on Islam, to share her life as a Muslim living in Rochester.

Listen to the children A 2014 Summer Reflection from Good Earth Village, by Evan Berg

Each day we had a bible study with a different theme. Monday's theme was connecting to God through nature and through each other. For our bible study Michael Determan and I took our campers to a place called The Shelf. It's a nice flat space that drops off and looks out over the river valley. As an activity, I had the campers go around the space and find items that connected them to God. The campers came back with items they had collected, and shared how they represented God. Most of the responses were "This stick reminds me of God because He made it". I noticed that Brody Vrieze was standing off to the side looking at a tree. I asked him if he'd share what connected him to God. He continued to look at the tree and then explained to everyone that "this tree is God's love because it is the biggest one in the woods and its roots spread to all of the other trees." He then said that God's love for us is enormous and spreads to everyone. He left Michael and me pretty speechless. It was such an amazing thing to realize and we felt pretty proud knowing he came from Mount Olive :) Another week one of the parent chaperones brought up the tree again but in a different way. Underneath the tree are a lot of rocks. He noticed, however, that the tree was able to go around the rocks to reach the surface. He said that this is a lot like God's presence in our lives. We sometimes put up a shield resisting God and those around us. However, God knows how to get around the rocks of our lives and nourish us: God's love always prevails. So thank you Brody for showing me a new way of looking at the things around us.



A Baby Care Kit from LWR is like a promise. It says to that baby and family, *Your needs will not be neglected by this world. You matter to us.* It provides encouragement by welcoming these little ones into an international community that cares.



Baby Care Kits are distributed as part of emergency and relief efforts, to be sure, but they are also given out as part of LWR health initiatives to encourage women to seek prenatal care. **Items needed for the Baby Care Kit:**

- Two lightweight cotton t-shirts
- Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel
- Four cloth diapers

- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap
- · Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of gentle soap, in original wrapping
- Two diaper pins or large safety pins
